

## **Discussion Questions Course 104–2**

### **Large Group**

1. Does anyone remember our SuperTruth from our last lesson?
2. Should our shortcomings and failures stop us from doing what God wants us to do? Why?
3. What was Moses's weakness?
4. Could Moses trust God to give him wisdom and strength to say the right words at the right time? Why?

### **Small Group**

#### **Teaching**

1. What can we do about a weakness we have?
2. Would anybody like to share the results of your challenge? Were you able to help anyone with a job or burden?

#### **Prayer**

1. How did the people feel, with the sea in front of them and the Egyptian army behind them? Were the Israelites speaking out of faith or fear—out of strength or weakness?

### **Additional Activities**

#### **Action Game**

1. When a can is knocked over, read the corresponding numbered weakness from the list. Ask the children to prayerfully consider if this is an area of weakness or strength for them.

### **Fulcrum Object Lesson**

1. Who remembers our SuperTruth today?
2. Weakness is the opposite of strength isn't it? In other words, if you are strong in an area, you aren't weak, correct?
3. What is the joy of the Lord?
4. What did Jesus say was another way you could have joy?

### **Battery Object Lesson**

1. Why do you think Moses needed God's strength to overcome his weakness in speaking to Pharaoh?
2. Why did he need God's strength to overcome his weakness in leading God's people and pushing back the water of the Red Sea?
3. Now, look at these batteries. Do you see a difference on the outside?
